

In addition to meeting the program eligibility requirements listed on the [program webpage](#), owners of single-family homes, townhomes, condominiums, and mobile homes must provide proof of current enrollment in an income-based eligibility program to participate in the DRIP Program.

Exceptions may be considered on a case-by-case basis for renter-occupied properties if the tenant is currently enrolled in a qualifying income-based assistance program, maintains an active water utility account for the property, and the property owner authorizes participation by signing the Participation Agreement.

Acceptable documentation includes a letter of enrollment, approval, or benefits from the administering agency; a copy of the enrollment card; or a utility statement showing active participation in the qualifying program.

Examples of eligible programs include, but are not limited to:

- California Tribal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)
- California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKS)
- Cash Assistance Program for Immigrants (CAPI)
- California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARES)
- Food Stamps/CalFresh/SNAP
- General Assistance or General Relief (GA/GR)
- Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)
- Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP)
- Medi-Cal
- Santa Clara County General Assistance (GA) Program
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)
- Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) Program

Income-based eligibility programs not listed will be considered on a case-by-case basis by Valley Water staff.
